World Book Day 2025



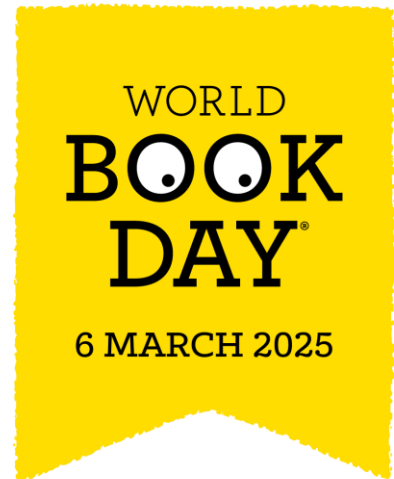
We are excited to be celebrating World Book Day on Thursday, 6th March 2025 at Lindsworth School! This special event is an opportunity to encourage a love of reading, spark imagination, and help our students develop essential literacy skills.

The Importance of Reading for Pleasure

Reading for pleasure has a profound impact on children's learning and development. Research shows that young people who enjoy reading:

- Develop stronger literacy skills
- Perform better in school
- Have improved focus and creativity
- Experience reduced stress and improved well-being

We know that reading confidence plays a key role in academic success, and we are committed to helping every student develop a positive relationship with books.



Supporting Your Child's Reading at Home

Encouraging reading at home doesn't have to mean sitting down with a novel for hours. Here are some simple ways to make reading a fun and engaging part of everyday life:

- Read together – Share a book, magazine, or even an interesting news article. Discuss what you've read to build comprehension skills.
- Use audiobooks – Listening to books can help with vocabulary and enjoyment, especially for reluctant readers.
- Let them choose – Whether it's comics, sports articles, or fantasy novels, any reading is good reading!
- Talk about books – Ask what they're reading in school, their favourite stories, or what they'd like to read next.



World Book Day Activities

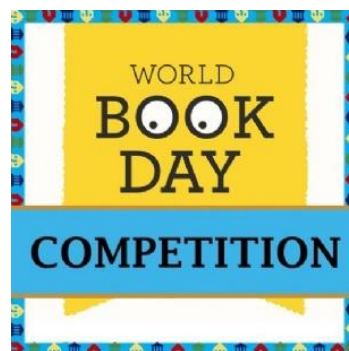
- Form Time Sessions – Each form will take part in dedicated reading sessions, sharing and discussing books together.
- Promoting Reading Across School – We will be running initiatives to encourage reading in different subjects and highlighting the importance of literacy.
- Art Competition – Students can enter a competition to Design a National Book Token; prizes include:

FIRST PRIZE in each age range wins:

- £350 National Book Tokens for the school
- £100 National Book Tokens for the pupil

SECOND PRIZE in each age range wins:

- £200 National Book Tokens for the school
- £50 National Book Tokens for the pupil
