Dear Parents and Carers,

We are writing to provide reassurance following recent media coverage relating to fire safety works at the school.

We understand that reports of this nature can understandably cause concern, particularly for families trusting us with the care and wellbeing of their children. We want to be clear and transparent: the school remains safe and operational, and the safety of pupils is, and always will be, our highest priority.

The school is subject to regular fire safety inspections, and fire doors and other safety-critical elements are routinely checked by qualified technical advisers working on behalf of Birmingham City Council. Where any damage or deterioration is identified, action is taken promptly to ensure the building remains safe and compliant.

Some of the issues referred to publicly relate to planned improvement works, rather than an immediate or unmanaged risk. Due to the nature of daily use in a busy school environment, some fittings, such as fire doors, can be prone to wear or damage over time. To address this, Birmingham City Council is progressing a more robust, longer-term solution to improve resilience and reduce the need for repeated repairs.

In the meantime, appropriate measures remain in place, monitoring continues, and any identified issues are dealt with swiftly. We are working closely with Birmingham City Council and relevant technical advisers to ensure that all necessary improvements are delivered safely and as quickly as possible.
